

Dear Ophelia Brown,

My name is Brian Wright and I have been searching for my long lost daughter for 12 years now and I believe you might be her. I'm sure you are confused right now but if you hear the full story, I'm sure you'll understand.

My wife gave birth to a child on the 13th of October 2012 (which a believe is your birthday) and sadly passed away while giving birth. 

Why did you become Police Officers?
